The Church is still not allowing events that are open to the public, so the schedule for the RAA 2020/2021 season is mostly canceled. The Board has decided to cancel the season for at least the rest of this calendar year. We are hoping that something will break so that we can have some of the spring events, but that is unlikely, and you should assume that a previously scheduled event will be canceled unless you hear otherwise.


We have openings on the schedule, so let us know if you want to be put on the schedule to display your painting.
