Rick will do a demonstration of his hyper-realistic graphite technique.

Rick is a 2020 graduate of the Academy of Realist Art in Boston Masters Program. Initially Rick wanted to be an architect, but due to a tragic childhood, he was a poor student, often missing classes and falling behind the other students. Rick was advised at a young age to find a different career path because he just wasn't smart enough to handle the curriculum. Rick took this advice and used it to fuel the fire inside him which turned into passion. Rick lost interest in school, since he was a bad student, he didn't see a point in going anymore. Often skipping school, Rick spent hours upon hours studying the Old Masters at the local library. He would sit for hours, copying their works in pencil over and over again - Degas, Monet, Leonardo became his "friends and family", to him they were all he knew. It wasn't until he saw Albrecht Durer's illustration of a "Young Hare", it was at that moment, he knew he wanted to be a realistic artist.


The American Artists Professional League included her painting in their NYC annual exhibit at the Salmagundi Club and was awarded the FASO Bold Brush Award.
